Keep Grass Clippings on the Lawn

Please do not blow your grass clippings onto the streets or sidewalks. Blow clippings back onto your lawn to add FREE FERTILIZER to your lawn, not into the City's storm sewer system.

Where Does Your Water Go?

Did you know the rainwater (or snowmelt) that falls on your property ends up in the Crow River? It's part of how watersheds work. Watersheds are areas of land that drain to a common body of water. In and around New Germany, the rain or snowmelt that doesn't soak into the ground washes off the surface and travels through a ditch system to the Crow River.

This water is called storm water runoff, because it runs off the surface of our driveways, roofs, sidewalks, compacted soil, and even lawns if there is too much of it. The runoff picks up pollutants along the way and delivers them to the Crow River. So it's very important to keep pollutants off your yard to prevent them from being washed into the river. Here are some things you can do.

Phosphorus is a nutrient that causes algae blooms in lakes and creeks. It binds very strongly to soil, so prevent

erosion and keep soil from washing into the street. Remove leaves from the street. Rake leaves, seeds, and

grass clippings out of the street and gutter. Compost on site or bag and take to city's compost drop off.

Fertilize your lawn, not the creek. Most lawns are naturally high in phosphorus and will remain healthy without

adding more, so choose a zero-phosphorus fertilizer. Sweep spilled fertilizer off paved surfaces. And re-

member, compost and manure (pet waste) contain phosphorus too. Keep the pavement clean. Sweep up

grass clippings and spills from driveways, sidewalks and streets. Be a responsible pet owner and scoop the

poop. Pet waste contains phosphorus and harmful bacteria.



Clean Water August Tip: Don't rake grass clippings and leaves into the street. Leave them on your lawn, use them for compost or bag them up. Left in the street, they get washed into storm drains and nearby lakes and rivers and cause algae blooms. Mulched on the lawn, they add natural fertilizer and help keep your grass healthy.

Sheriff number to call in complaints - all calls use 911

If you need to notify somebody of a barking dog (day or night), or late night noises, speeding vehicles or fireworks, etc., or anything that is not an emergency, you still use the 911 number. You do not need to leave a note or phone message at the city office *unless you want to file a formal complaint*. The Sheriff can respond to an incident while it is happening instead of hearing about it later, when they can no longer do anything about it. You can request your name be withheld. There are some issues that need to be dealt with while they are happening for better results.

The City of New Germany is now taking applicants for citizens interested in planning, zoning and other related matters of the city, to serve on the Planning Commission. The Commission meets as needed or as requested in the City Office in the City Hall at 300 Broadway Street East.

The Planning Commission consists of five members and it is a three year term. Each member will receive a copy of the Subdivision Code, Zoning Code and Comprehensive Plan; each member will be required to study and be knowledgeable about the code.

Applications can be picked up at City Hall between 8:30 AM – 4:30 PM Monday – Thursday. You may also request an application to be e mailed by e mailing <u>ngcityhall@gmail.com</u>.
