As the leaves change those beautiful autumn colors look great on the trees. But as the leaves fall to the street they threaten to pollute lakes and rivers. That's because leaves contain tons of phosphorus. Phosphorus is a nutrient that helps things grow. When leaves breakdown on the soil, that phosphorus goes back into the ground helping new plant growth. When leaves that fall upon streets or sidewalks get washed into lakes and rivers, that phosphorus causes algae blooms in the water.

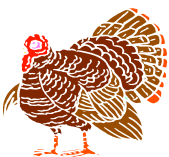
Streets can collect a lot of pollutants. Along with leaves, there are grass clippings (also have loads of phosphorus), trash, road salt (in winter), construction debris, and road wear and tear. All of which get washed into lakes and rivers when it rains.

Street sweepers reduce pollutants coming from streets and prevent them from getting into lakes and rivers by removing pollutants from the street and disposing of them properly. Every fall, many cities send out street sweepers to help remove pollutants and keep storm drains from getting clogged.

Do your part as a homeowner to keep your neighborhood nice and waters clean. Do not push leaves or grass clippings into the street for the sweeper to pick up. Sweepers fill up fast, and multiple loads mean a lot more staff time, wear and tear on the sweeper and gas used. Be responsible and haul your leaves to your city's compost pile or better yet mulch them on the spot and provide free fertilizer for your yard.

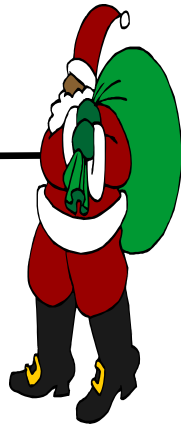

WINTER & SNOW-FALL PARKING RULES

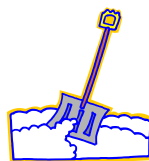
Parking—No Parking on City Streets between 2am & 7am beginning Nov. 1 thru March 31

Snowfall Parking Rules—No Parking on city streets following a snowfall of 1" or more.


Penalty—If your car is parked illegally during snow plowing, the Sheriffs Dept. will be called and you will receive a ticket.

Sidewalks—It is your responsibility to keep your sidewalk free from snow & ice.

Garbage Service—will be one day later the week of Thanksgiving.
