If you do not send in a water meter reading you will be charged a penalty fee of \$10.00, this is only if your meter is a manual read meter. Any bill that is delinquent more than 60 days can legally be shut off. Each certified letter that is mailed is costly. If you can't pay your bill in full-make a partial payment. If you can't pay anything at least send in or CALL in a meter reading—You will at least save yourself the \$10 penalty. Leave a message after hours or write it on a piece of paper with your address and drop in the drop box. There is a shut-off fee of \$25 and a reconnect fee of \$25. There are 8 meters left to replace and everyone will be on auto reads. Auto reads do not need to write any meter readings. Call if you are unsure if you are



Carver County Offers 1 FREE Radon Test Kit to Carver County Resident.

Limited quantities available - when supplies run out the prices are; short term kit \$8/ long term kit \$20

Carver County will offer 1 radon test kit per home owner if you live in Carver County at no charge to homeowners during **January** which is Radon Action Month.

The Minnesota Department of Health recommends that all homes in Minnesota be tested for radon. It's the only way to know if your home has elevated levels of radon, which can cause lung cancer. Radon is an odorless, colorless, tasteless gas that occurs naturally in Minnesota soils and can enter homes primarily through cracks and openings in basements or foundation floors and walls. MDH estimates that one in three existing Minnesota homes have radon levels that pose a large health risk over many years of exposure. Radon is the second leading cause of lung cancer in the United States and more than 21,000 deaths are attributed to radon each year. Radon test kits will be available at no charge during the month of January at the Carver County Environmental Center ONLY. Limit one test kit per household and while supplies last. Proof of residency is required. Kits will be available at the Environmental Center during winter collection hours which are: Wednesdays 12:00pm-7:00pm; Thursdays 11:00am- 5:00pm; and Saturdays 8:00am-12:00pm. The facility is closed during all other times.
