COVID-19 Vaccine Info Update

Who Can Receive the Vaccine Now?

This week, the County plans to host two large vaccine clinics, focusing on residents considered essential and frontline workers, school staff, and those residents who are also eligible in Phase 1b, tiers 2-3, who have signed up for the State's Vaccine Connector. The County receives a list from the State of residents in the Vaccine Connector, and they're invited to the clinics directly, as space allows. These clinics should serve around 1,800 residents over two days, and residents will be invited directly by their employer, or via email or phone from the Vaccine Connector. State Continues Vaccinating Eligible Residents

The State expects to receive 100,000 doses of the Janssen/Johnson & Johnson vaccine this week, which requires only one dose. This vaccine has proved very effective in preventing serious disease and death, as well as protection against the virus. The State also plans to announce more details on future priority groups soon, as well as a timeline for serving these next groups. The State continues to encourage residents to register for the [Vaccine Connector tool](#), which can also be reached via phone at (833) 431-2053. As supplies continue to increase, the lists generated by this tool are helpful to public health officials to contact eligible residents. Residents can also find and book appointments with healthcare providers or pharmacies from the [Vaccine Locator map](#).

Carver County COVID-19 Call Center Launches

This week, Carver County Public Health launched its COVID-19 Call Center. Residents can call (952) 361-1559 with questions about COVID-19 testing, vaccine eligibility, and assistance in registering for a vaccine for those unable to sign-up online. The call center is available Monday-Friday, 8:00 am - 4:30 pm. If you receive a voice mail, please leave a message and a staff member will return your call.

Schools and our local college are seeing an increase in COVID-19 cases. Some school clusters are associated with the B.1.1.7 variant, which is known to be more infectious, and we are seeing this play out with greater transmission in the school setting. There has also been a recent increase in the number of local business outbreaks. While some people in the community are fully vaccinated, many are not. MDH recommends all students returning to school and their families get tested every two weeks through the end of the school year. Kids involved in activities or sports should get tested weekly. While we continue to vaccinate, please continue practicing key prevention strategies to keep our community safe:

- Wear a cloth face covering when outside of your home
- Wait 6 feet from people you do not live with
- Wash your hands or use hand sanitizer often
- Stay home if you don't feel well

- 22,447 – Number of residents receiving at least one vaccine dose as of 3/22/2021
- 13,886 – Number of residents receiving both first and second doses of vaccine as of 3/22/2021
- 85.5% – Percentage of County residents 65+ with at least one vaccine dose as of 3/20/2021
- 24.9% – Percentage of County residents 50-64 years with at least one vaccine dose as of 3/20/21




