The program began in 2017 in Minnesota, and since that has grown to 5 states. In Minnesota there are 10,000 volunteers who have adopted 19,0000 drains and have prevented 500,000 lbs. of debris from getting into local lakes and rivers. The impacts have been

Clean storm drains help lakes

Rain washes anything that's on streets and paved surfaces down storm drains and into lakes and rivers. Many people do not know that "natural" debris—leaves, grass clippings, fertilizer, road salt, and pet waste—becomes pollution when it hits the water. When these natural pollutants break down, they become food for algae, causing it to grow out of control.

When residents sign up for the program, they'll receive an e-mail with instructions on how to safely clear storm drains, dispose of the debris, and report the amount of debris they collect.





Snow parking rules— NO parking on city streets following a snowfall of 1" or more.

NO parking on city streets between 2 AM—7 AM beginning November 1 thru March 31.

PENALTY—If your car is parked illegally during snow plowing, the Sheriff Dept., will be called and you would receive a ticket.
