December through March Saturdays 8 AM—12 PM.

Ordinance code 92.03 (O) Shipping containers, storage containers, temporary structures, and the storage of boats, campers, trailers and other recreational relate items shall not remain in one area for more than 180 days. Items that are required to be licensed shall be currently licensed and shall be parked on an

impervious, concrete or asphalt surface.

Lithium-ion batteries store a lot of energy in a small place. These batteries can overheat, start a fire, or explode if overcharged or damaged. By learning how to BUY, CHARGE, and RECYCLE these batteries safely, you can help prevent a fire in your home.



Buy only listed products. When buying a product that uses a lithium-ion battery look for a safety certification mark such as UL, ETL, or CSA. This means it meets important safety standards.



Charge devices safely. Always use the cables that came with the product to charge. Follow the instructions from the manufacturer. Buy new chargers from the manufacturer or one that the manufacturer has approved.



Charge your device on a hard surface. Don't overcharge your device. Unplug it or remove the battery when it's fully charged. Recycle your device or battery at a safe battery recycling location. Visit call2recycle.org to find a recycling spot near you.



STOP using your device right away if the battery smells weird, gets too hot, makes popping noises, changes in shape or color. If it is safe, move the device away from anything that can catch fire. Call 9-1-1.



Recycle batteries responsibly. Don't throw Lithium-ion batteries in the trash or regular recycling bins because they could start a fire.

Wastewater (Sewer) Project Update

The State of MN did not pass any local bonding requests in the 2025 year. The City will be submitting another bonding bill for 2026 for the wastewater project upgrades. The City did receive a federal grant last year for \$2.2 million, the wastewater upgrade project to address the capacity issues is approximately 12 million (increases every year). In order for the project to move forward the bonding bill is a key factor. Council's main priority is a bonding bill and not to borrow any additional funds for the wastewater project as this would make the sewer rates increase significantly. Council does not want significant increases on the sewer rates as the residents are already burden with higher utility rates from the last water project, and the city is still paying on this debt (that is why the utility rates are higher). The residents cannot afford an significant sewer rate increases for this wastewater project. Without the wastewater project the City cannot allow any additional new homes, and or business's without approval by the MPCA. MPCA did approve the business connection that is under construction on 62nd Street; Lakeland Fiberglass, this will be a fiberglass boat repair business.
