The General Election will be held on November 3, 2026, from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. at New Germany City Hall for New Germany residents. Unless you are a Waconia resident, the voting options listed below are available at the Carver County Government Center. Absentee voting is available from September 18 through November 2, 2026. In-person early voting is available from October 16 through November 2, 2026, at the Carver County Government Elections Department. Eligible Minnesota voters may vote absentee by mail or in person. Apply online at mnvotes.gov or through the Carver County Government Elections Department. To vote, you must be a U.S. citizen, be at least 18 years old on Election Day, and have lived in Minnesota for at least 20 days. Every ballot counts—please remember to vote.

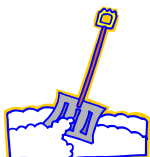
**WINTER & SNOWFALL PARKING
RULES**

Parking—No Parking on City Streets be-
tween 2am & 7am beginning Nov. 1 thru
March 31

Snowfall Parking Rules—No Parking on city
streets following a snowfall of 1" or more.

Penalty—If your car is parked illegally dur-
ing snow plowing, the Sheriffs Dept. will be
called and you will receive a ticket.

Sidewalks—It is your responsibility to
keep your sidewalk free from snow & ice.



Only Rain Down the Drain

Two types of water leave your home. One is waste water, which is water that goes down drains in sinks, toilets, and showers. Waste water gets treated at wastewater treatment facilities. Trash, bacteria and other pollutants are removed, and the water is purified and released. The second type of water that leaves your home is stormwater runoff. Runoff is rain that's fallen on rooftops, driveways, and sidewalks. It can't soak into the ground, so it *runs off* the surface. Runoff does NOT get treated. Instead, it flows to the nearest storm drain.

Storm drains typically drain to a nearby lake, river, or stormwater pond.

To protect lakes and rivers from pollutants, we must also protect these storm drains. It's very important that *only rain goes down the drain*. It is illegal to dump anything else down these storm drains. Any pollutants dumped down the drain pollute lakes and rivers and risk harm to public health and wildlife. The following actions protect lakes and rivers.

Fall is a particularly important time for protecting storm drains. Leaves, grass clippings and debris that builds up along curbs and storm drains all contain phosphorus. Too much phosphorus in a lake causes algae blooms and reduces oxygen in the water. Leaves and grass clippings that get into lakes and rivers via storm drains add to next year's summer algae blooms. Multiple lakes in Carver County frequently have algae blooms during summer. Just one-yard waste bag of leaves has enough phosphorus to create 100 lbs. of algae in water.

This fall season, as you prep your yard, home and garage for winter. Take these actions to protect storm drains and so protect your lakes and rivers. Take used oil, unwanted chemicals and other household hazardous wastes to the Carver County Environmental Center or special waste drop off.

Sweep your garage and place debris in trash, instead of hosing it down. De-chlorinate your pool water before draining. Chlorine is not good for wildlife.

Remove leaves, grass clippings from driveways, curbs, sidewalks and storm drains, bag them and take to a compost facility. Don't dump anything down storm drains.
